PURPOSE: Improve access to technology for students and educators

The Clinton Bush Haiti Fund's \$285,646 grant to EducaTech, a Haitian information technology firm, used technology to improve the quality of education at INAGHEI, the UEH's School of Management.

With the grant, EducaTech developed the university's computer lab, stocked with computers, projectors, and digital boards. The lab connected students with high speed, broadband Internet service donated by NATCOM, a telecom operator in Haiti. Equipment and training from this grant allowed the institute to take advantage of this connectivity.

As part of establishing this lab, EducaTech hosted a training program so students enter the professional world with the skills to succeed. The training focused on the use of research databases and business management software, such as Excel, PowerPoint, and QuickBooks.
